



Hybrid Honeydew Melon Honeycomb



DESCRIPTION: Early-mid season desert hybrid Honeydew melon. Slightly oval with a small seed cavity and very smooth skin. Its thick flesh is medium-firm and sweet.

MATURITY: Early, maturing 40 days after flowering

COMPARABLE VARIETIES: Santa Fe

CULTURAL CHARACTERISTICS: Honeycomb is an early maturing Honeydew melon known for its excellent fruit-setting ability. A strong, vigorous vine provides ample protection for the fruit. Resistant to Powdery mildew and Fusarium race 0 & 2
