

Hybrid Onion Frontier (T 400)



DESCRIPTION: Yellow, long day, Northern storage type

MATURITY: Early maturing (95-100 days)

COMPARABLE VARIETIES: Prince, Tamara, Uniglobe 100

CULTURAL CHARACTERISTICS: This early hybrid long-day onion has flattened-globe bulbs and is suitable for the eastern storage and western export markets. Frontier has excellent size and uniformity and under optimum conditions can be stored until early April. Skins are excellent, dark golden in color and necks are small. This variety is resistant to Downy mildew, Fusarium basal rot, soft rot (*Botritis allii*), and bacterial soft rot, however it is susceptible to Pink Root.

ADAPTABILITY: Pacific Northwest, coastal California, Northeastern and Midwestern US, and Canada
